

Annual Meeting 2022 Report



The 2022 Annual Meeting was held on September 13th, a beautiful day in El Dorado Springs. It started early as members were lined up in their vehicles to register. Sac Osage Electric Cooperative conducted an all-day drive through registration prior to the business meeting at 6:30. This is the third year Sac Osage has had a drive through registration and it has turned into a bit of a car show as members took the opportunity to parade



through the warehouse. 1,309 members passed

through the Cooperative's warehouse from 9:00AM to 6:30PM to register and collect their door prize. This was the biggest turnout for any Annual Meeting. High gas prices did not keep members from traveling from as far away as Henry County.

At 6:30 the business meeting was called to order by board president, Ken Hacker. Mr. Hacker opened the meeting with the Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance, then



turned the business meeting over to Chris Hoberock, the Cooperative's attorney.

The business meeting announced the reelection of Tim Minehardt in District 1 and Tony Underwood in District 2, both were running unopposed. No member petitioned for the position of District 3, and the Cooperative

By-laws call for the board of directors to appoint someone to that seat.

Tim Minehardt gave the secretary's report which showed the cooperative in good financial standing. Ken Hacker gave the President's Report and turned the meeting over to General Manager, Jim Davis. Mr. Davis has announced his retirement and knew that this would be his last Annual Meeting as an employee of the cooperative. He expressed his thanks to the board, employees, and especially to the membership for making his long career at Sac Osage possible.

The board of directors met immediately after the Annual Meeting for reorganization. Ken Hacker of District 8 was chosen as the new board president. Jim Murray of District 7 was chosen as Vice President. Tim Minehardt of District 1 was chosen as Assistant Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer.

leaks. Save up to 15% of your heating dollars by caulking, sealing and weatherstripping wherever outside meets inside.

Take care of your furnace. Replace or clean the furnace filter each month you heat; dirty filters can affect the heating ability of the furnace and waste valuable fuel.
