Members Give Back Through Operation Round-Up

This money will help keep these programs going to serve citizens in our area who need some extra help.

The funds are raised by members who have agreed to have their electric bill rounded up to the next whole dollar. So, if their electric bill is \$103.20, eighty cents goes into the fund, and the member writes a check for \$104 even. The maximum donation is never more than eleven dollars and eightyeight cents a year, and averages right

around six dollars a year.

For most members the spare change given to get to the next whole dollar will never be missed. Put together with the other Sac Osage Members' donations, this money adds up to a real difference in the rural community.

Take Pictures in All Season For the 2023 **Calendar Contest**



Each year Sac Osage Electric gives free calendars to members from our cooperative headquarters. This year members have the opportunity to submit their own pictures to be a part of the calendar. Winning members will receive a credit on their electric bill. Requirements are:

- Photo must be taken by the member of Sac Osage Electric Cooperative submitting the entry.
- Photo must be taken within the cooperative territory.
- Photos should be in a landscape (wider than it is long) to fit the cal-

By submitting the photo through the website, the member is giving permission to Sac Osage to use the photo in the calendar and other promotional material.

Members can submit multiple entries, but a new form must be filled out with each one. Sac Osage encourages members to take photos in all seasons as this will increase the chances of being included in the calendar. Fight Back Against Scams

Scammers are targeting energy consumers everywhere. They often call threatening to shut off power unless payment is made immediately. Or they may call saying you overpaid and ask for credit card or bank info to provide a credit.

Never give out personal information to anyone who calls claiming to be from your utility!

Many of these scam attempts play out like this: the caller poses as a representative of your power provider, says you are behind on the bill and a truck is on the way to disconnect your service unless you pay your bill right now - over the phone. Some ask their targets to purchase prepaid cards and call back with the prepaid card number to pay the bill. If you get such a call, or have questions about your bill, call your utility using the number they provide on the bill or online.

Attempts have also been made in person at the door or via email. If your provider needs to replace or service equipment in your home, they will contact you in advance. Never respond to an email that claims to be from your utility that asks for personal informa-

If consumers suspect someone is trying to scam them, they should hang up, delete the email, or shut the door. They should call their utility (800-876-2701 for Sac Osage) at the number on their monthly bill or the utility's website, not the phone number the scammer provides. If consumers ever feel

that they are in physical danger, they should call 911.

Consumers who suspect that they have been victims of fraud should also contact local law enforcement authorities. The Federal Trade Commission's website (www.ftc.gov) is also a good source of information about how to protect personal information. This article is from safeelectricity.org

Don't Let Your Trees Become Your Neighbor's Outage



The major cause of most power outages is damage to power lines due to falling trees and branches. Clearing right of way is a time consuming and hazardous job. Over 1 million dollars a year is expended on right of way maintenance. Maintaining right of way is a never ending concern to provide reliable service to Sac Osage

Sac Osage works to clear our threephase line on a rotation basis, but we rely on members to allow us to trim or remove trees on their property. If tree crews are not allowed to properly clear trees from yards, it can impact neighbors down the road.
